

Copycats

Helpful Parenting Tips:

- Babies are active learners form the start! Think of your home as your child's first classroom, and everybody in your home as your child's first teacher.
- Remember that babies watch and might copy the things we so right from birth. Try to provide positive examples early on.
- Be careful about what your child sees on television. Remember that babies don't know what's safe to do and what's dangerous. They might copy something they've seen on television days or weeks after watching it.

Parent Teacher Partnership Helpful Tips you can do before a Parent Teacher Conference

- 1. Talk to your child.
- 2. Prepare a list of questions.
- 3. Go to the conference prepared.
- 4. Remain calm.
- 5. Express your opinion clearly and listen closely.
- 6. Ask to find out about his/her strengths.
- 7. Take notes on important comments.
- 8. Follow up on any agreements.



Make sure each party does what is agreed upon.
